

Our experiences not indicative of most Steelhead Alley fishing


We predominanty fished the small tributaries of the Grand River

0x – 2x Leader & Tippet


Full Waders


First Ohio & Steelhead Trip

BE PREPARED FOR THE WEATHER

- Layers
- Good Gloves, warm socks, knit hat
- Extra gloves, hot hands



First Ohio & Steelhead Trip



CONSIDER DISTANCE TO STREAM

- Carry everything you might need
- May not be feasible to go back to car
- Finding the right balance



First Ohio & Steelhead Trip

- Go early to get prime spots
 - - Be at the stream at sun rise



First Ohio & Steelhead Trip

Use one fly rig to mitigate snags & tangles





First Ohio & Steelhead Trip

Nets & Cooperative Netting

Find the right balance between size and portability



Be ready and know how to net the fish for your buddy



First Ohio & Steelhead Trip



• Remember your cold weather gear

• Surprised by the weather changes





First Ohio & Steelhead Trip



Swinging Streamers worked for us



-- Casting down and swinging through



First Ohio & Steelhead Trip



- Biggest Surprise: Size of the fish
 - - Relative to the size of the stream







First Ohio & Steelhead Trip


- Prepare for the weather . . . and the stairs
- It's not rainbow trout fishing, let them run ...
- "I want the onion rings, but no onion."



Semi First Timer Comments


Steelhead Experience but First Ohio Trip

- Be prepared to walk steep grades & stairs
- Constantly adjust indicator to water depth
- In low, clear water watch the fly, not the indicator




Multiple Ohio Trips

- Learn to read the water
- Don't assume water will be like previous trips



Multiple Ohio Trips

- Take pre-rigged leaders
- Don't waste time untangling leaders; cut it off and re-tie
- Carry extra split shot








Multiple Ohio Trips


Prior Trip Guy Comments Bad Weather = Good Fishing



A little rain, a tad cold = Fewer people & more active fish

What we typically see in the water




What we saw this year: Fish 'hiding' in the rock shadow (under ledges, even single rock ledges)

Prior Trips Guy Comments Some Rock Shadows are Fish




Just a rock with a shadow





Remember 1st Rule of Successful Fly Fishing




